Purpose of Social Institutions

- Social institutions are designed to meet universal needs
- Social and biological needs
- Care, shelter, livelihood, purpose, education, etc.



Institutions do not exist independently but overlap in meeting our needs



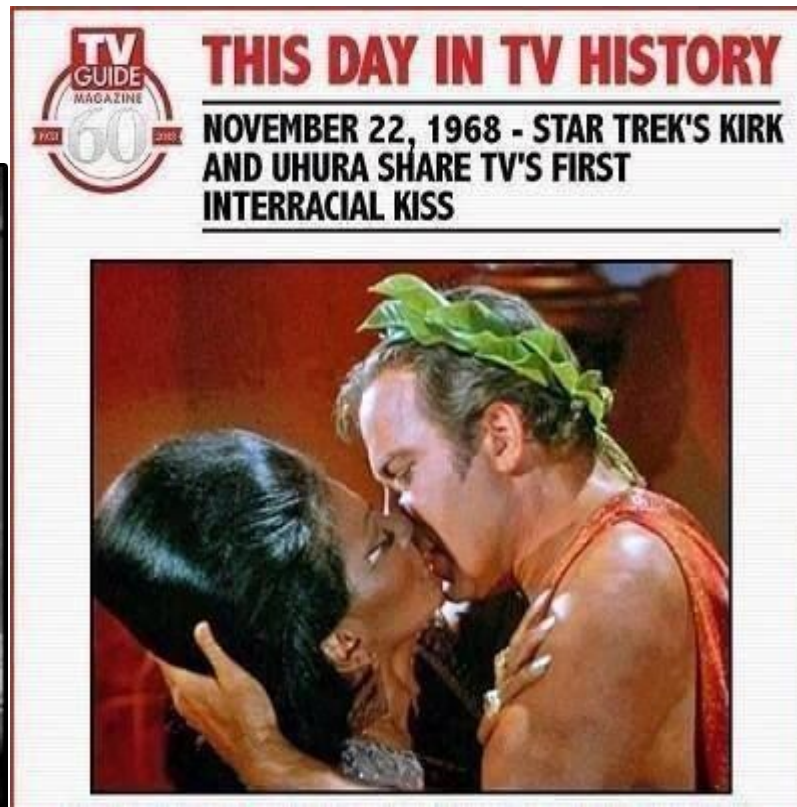
Institutions have a history

- Institutions establish “rules” or ways of doing things
- Individuals begin to accept these without question



Institutions continually change

How has the notion of the “family” changed throughout our history?



Institutions distribute resources unequally

- People are assigned to advantaged and disadvantaged groups
- The advantaged gain the benefits of the system
- The disadvantaged are taken advantage of, discriminated against, or completely shut out of the system

OVERDRAFT FEES COST consumers



➤ Overdraft fees paid by Americans annually: **\$17.5 billion.**

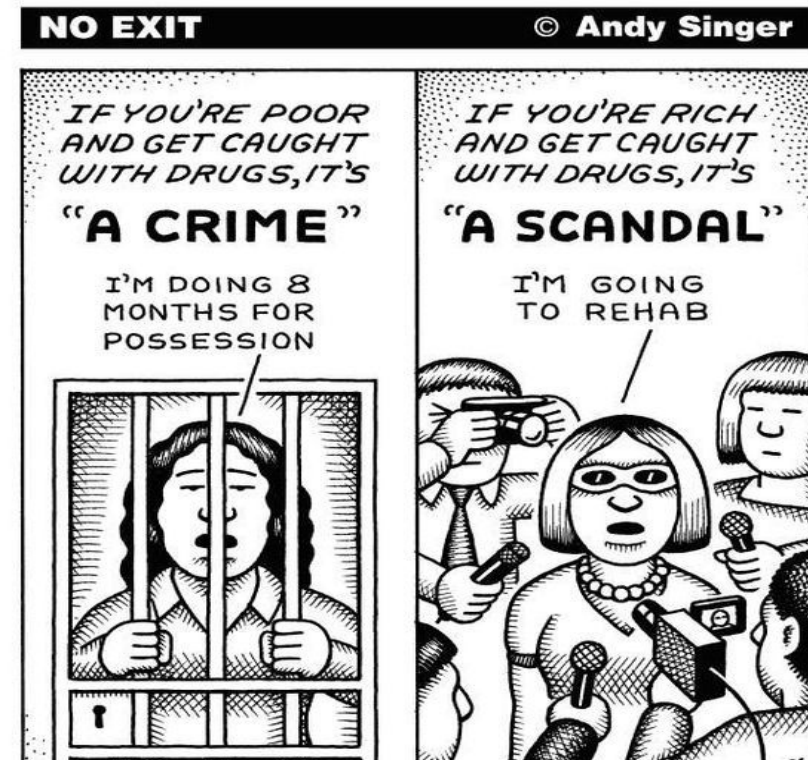
➤ Average size of transaction that triggers a debit card overdraft: **\$20.**

➤ Percentage of overdrafters who would rather be declined than pay \$35 overdraft fee: **68%.**

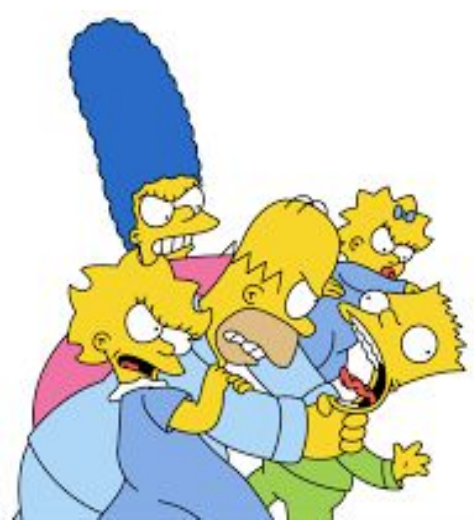

- Those who benefit the most = desire to maintain status quo

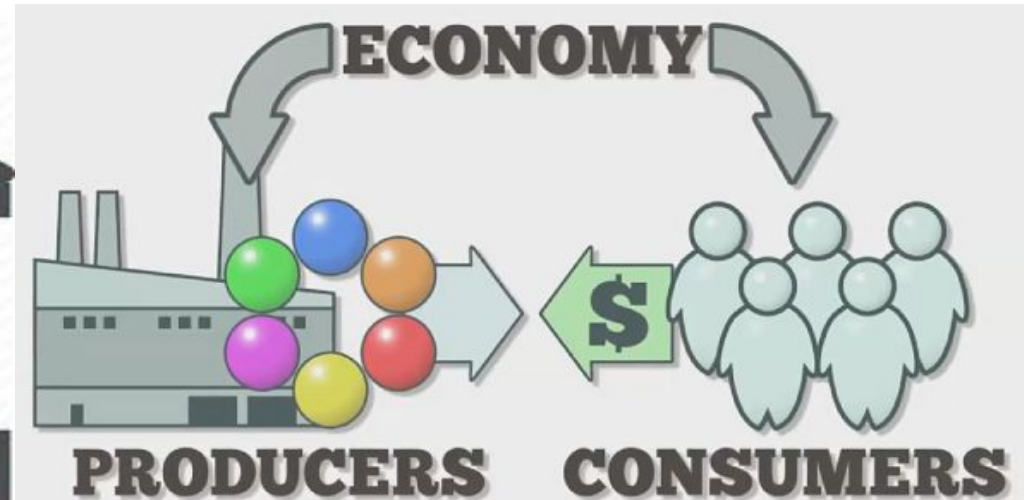
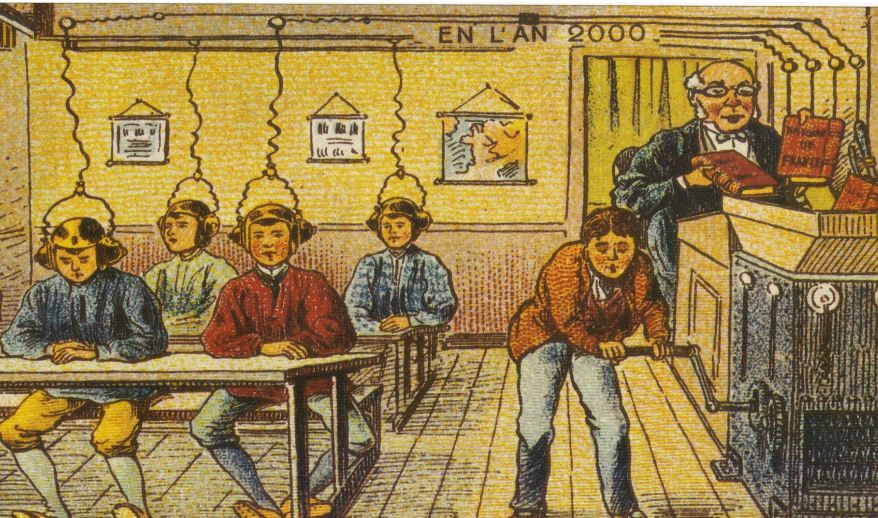




Social Institutions

- Providing care and protection
- Providing social status



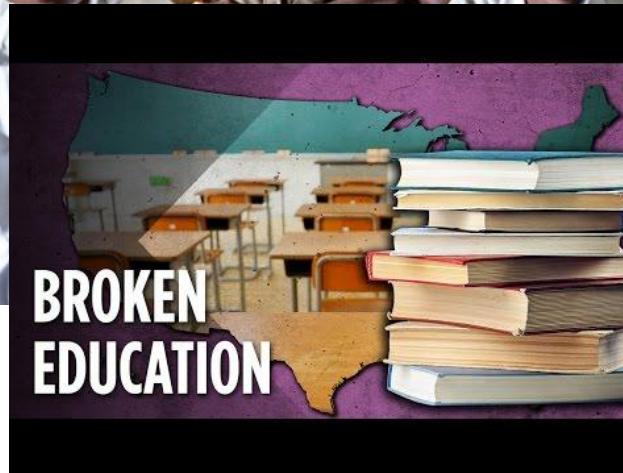
Functions of Religion

- Satisfying individual need
- Promote social cohesion
- Establish worldviews



Functions of Education

- Cultural transmission
- Establishing academic skills
- Foster innovation
- Provide child care outside of the family



Functions of Political System

- Establish laws and norms
- Provide social control
- Set goals for society
- Protect against outside threats



Functions of Economy

- Provide for financial stability
- Organize ownership of production and property
- Determine use and distribution of resources



Functions of Health Care

- Provide for physical care
- Determine use and distribution of medical resources



Functions of Justice System

- Provide for rehabilitation of criminals
- Provide protection from violent individuals

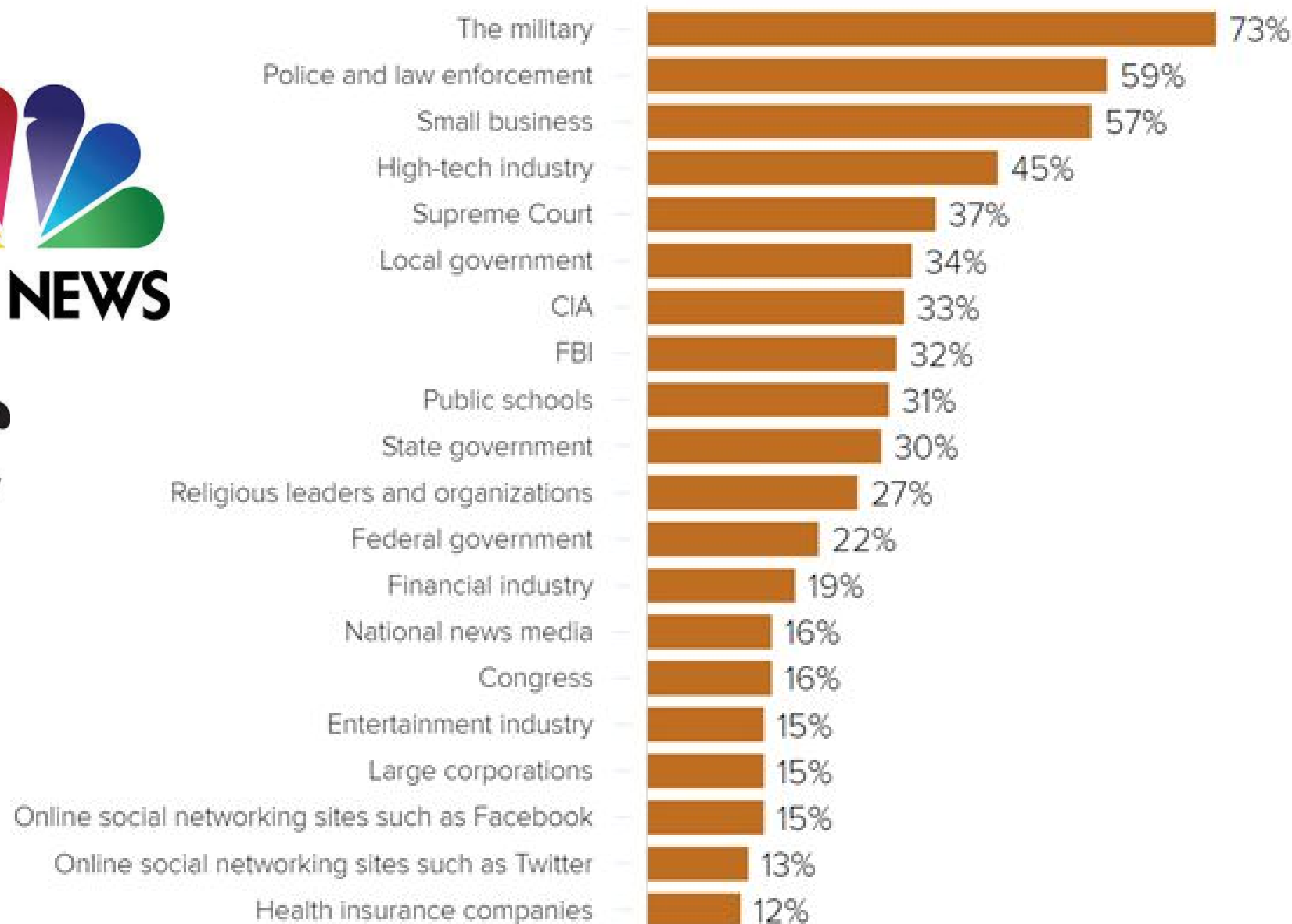
